



PE and Sport Premium for Primary Schools 2017-2018

At Donington Cowley Endowed Primary School we are committed to providing and developing a range of quality PE and Sports opportunities for our pupils.

Our Primary School PE and Sports funding will help us to build on and to extend our provision and to continue to promote healthy and active lifestyles for our children.

Each primary school has been allocated £16,000 plus £10 per pupil as part of this exciting initiative. The anticipated funding for our school is approximately £18,250. Schools are able to choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire special P.E. teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during P.E. lessons
- support and involve the least active children by running after-school clubs and holiday clubs, e.g. the Change4Life (<http://www.nhs.uk/change4life/pages/primary-schools-sports-clubs.aspx>) clubs
- provide resources and training courses in P.E. and sport for teachers
- run sport competition or increase pupils' participation in the School Games (<https://www.gov.uk/government/policies/getting-more-people-playing-sport/supporting-pages/the-school-games>)
- run sports activities with other schools

<p>1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity ~ kick starting healthy active lifestyles</p>	<p>All children will have a greater level of awareness and understanding of the positive impact of regular physical activity in terms of physical and emotional well-being.</p> <p>All children will be encouraged to be physically active during lunchtime.</p>	<p>The school has once again joined the Boston and District School Sports' Partnership. The school enters a range of festivals and tournaments throughout the year. The menu of events offers school the chance to ensure that children of all abilities are able to participate in development days during which they receive expert coaching before applying their skills within an inter school context.</p> <p>A new, larger netball court is to be painted onto the largest junior playground. Our after school netball club will be able to compete on a full sized court. With accessibility to two courts, all children can develop netball skills and play netball in their PE lessons successively.</p> <p>The Partnership Lead has delivered training to our Year 5 Playground Leaders. The pupils are now confident and able to set up and encourage the younger children to participate in new activities during lunchtime. <p>2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement</p>	<p>All children will have regular opportunities to participate in a range of intra-school events. All children are inspired to participate in regular physical activity.</p>	<p>The school fully recognises that all actions must be sustainable. This will ensure that the programme has a long term impact. The school has formed a partnership with Boston Netball Club. They support a successful after school netball club. Leanne Creek from Huntingdon Gymnastics Club has returned to run a gymnastics club for lower key stage 2 children. CMS Sports run a football club for KS2 children after school. Netball, gymnastics, cross country, dance and football extra-curricular clubs will continue throughout the academic year.</p> <p>The Year 6 Sports' Leaders will be trained by the Partnership Lead. They will complete Change4Life training. The Y6 children will then become leaders of the Change4Life Club and will form the Sports' Committee. The Sports Committee discusses the clubs menu and ensures that pupil voice is an important element of our work.</p> <p>Children will read reports about sporting events in assembly and show photographs.</p> <p>Ensure increased PE funding is spent effectively. Consult staff and sports committee as to how money could be effectively utilised.</p>	<p>£700</p>

Staff can work alongside Boston Netball Club, Leanne Creek from Huntingdon Gymnastics Club and CMS Sports football club to develop knowledge.</p>
