



PE and Sport Premium for Primary Schools 2016-2017

At Donington Cowley Endowed Primary School we are committed to providing and developing a range of quality PE and Sports opportunities for our pupils.

Our Primary School PE and Sports funding will help us to build on and to extend our provision and to continue to promote healthy and active lifestyles for our children.

Each primary school has been allocated £8,000 plus £5 per pupil as part of this exciting initiative. The total amount of funding for our school is approximately £9110. Schools are able to choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire special P.E. teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during P.E. lessons
- support and involve the least active children by running after-school clubs and holiday clubs, e.g. the Change4Life (<http://www.nhs.uk/change4life/pages/primary-schools-sports-clubs.aspx>) clubs
- provide resources and training courses in P.E. and sport for teachers
- run sport competition or increase pupils' participation in the School Games (<https://www.gov.uk/government/policies/getting-more-people-playing-sport/supporting-pages/the-school-games>)
- run sports activities with other schools

<p>1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity ~ kick starting healthy active lifestyles</p>	<p>All children will have a greater level of awareness and understanding of the positive impact of regular physical activity in terms of physical and emotional well-being.</p> <p>All children will be encouraged to be physically active during lunchtime.</p>	<p>The school has once again joined the Boston and District School Sports' Partnership. The school enters a range of festivals and tournaments throughout the year. The menu of events offers school the chance to ensure that children of all abilities are able to participate in development days during which they receive expert coaching before applying their skills within an inter school context.</p> <p>The Partnership Lead has delivered training to our Year 5 Playground Leaders. The pupils are now confident and able to set up and encourage the younger children to participate in new activities during lunchtime. They will be supported and advised by the PE Lead teacher to ensure that initial ideas are developed and that the approach is sustainable.</p>	<p>£2400 for membership of the Sports' Partnership</p>

IMPACT:

We continue to benefit greatly from our membership of the Sports Partnership. We have participated in a wide range of inter-school festivals, sports' development days and staff training.

Children from Years 5 and 6 thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to train as Playground Leaders. Lovely playtimes on our super field saw our Playground Leaders setting up games for the younger children and encouraging sharing, fun and physical exercise. The teamwork proved to be a real winner! The children took their responsibilities very seriously and the caring attitudes displayed towards the younger children show their commitment to helping and encouraging each other.

<p>2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement</p>	<p>All children will have regular opportunities to participate in a range of intra-school events. All children are inspired to participate in regular physical activity.</p>	<p>The school fully recognises that all actions must be sustainable. This will ensure that the programme has a long term impact. The school has funded and supported a Teaching Assistant to achieve the Level 2 Netball Coaching Qualification. This has had an impact on the number of children who participate in lunchtime and after school clubs. The school won the Boston and District Netball Championship, came third in The Lincolnshire County Finals and went on to represent Lincolnshire in the East Midlands Festival. The children are proud of each other and now everyone wants to play Netball! Children inspire each other. The clubs will continue throughout the academic year.</p> <p>The Year 6 Sports' Leaders will be trained by the Partnership Lead. They will complete Change4Life training. The Y6 children will then become leaders of the Change4Life Club and will form the Sports' Committee. The Sports Committee discusses the clubs menu and ensures that pupil voice is an important element of our work.</p>	<p>£685</p>
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IMPACT:

We have enjoyed many successes in sport this year and the children have had the opportunity to learn new skills and to develop an appreciation of how sport and Physical Education can impact on our health and well-being. As a school we have fully committed to ensuring that we have a full and exciting range of intra-school competitions which have included multi-skills, hockey and football.

<p>3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport</p>	<p>All children will have increased opportunities for learning new skills and applying such skills within a range of sports and physical activities.</p>	<p>Our TA who is now a qualified Netball Coach is spending some time further developing her skills by assisting with Netball within our neighbouring Secondary School. She is seconded to the PE Department for a session each week. This is further developing her expertise and knowledge.</p> <p>Excellent links with the Secondary School in the village are proving beneficial in the development of our staff. Staff and pupils from the Secondary School continue to work with us to offer skills training in football and basketball. The Partnership Lead continues to offer training for staff in new and established sports.</p>	
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IMPACT:

Our staff have developed new skills and ideas for teaching sport through participation in a wide range of inter-school festivals and sports' development days. Children have enjoyed learning basketball and football skills with the Year 9 BTEC sport students from our local Secondary School. They worked with great enthusiasm and developed skills and teamwork.

Our TA worked successfully within our school and local secondary school. She has now achieved a place for Teacher Training next year.

They will be helped to understand that there are lots of different sports to enjoy as we go through life.</p> <p>The children will be encouraged to celebrate and share activities in which they participate out of school.</p>	<p>Opportunities offered by the Boston Sports' Partnership and by the school's partnership with the Thomas Cowley Secondary School.</p> <p>During the school year, we are committed to providing clubs within Running, Football, Gymnastics, Netball, Dance, Cheerleading and Kwik Cricket.</p> <p>Opportunities offered through our work with Boston Tennis Club.</p>	<p>£4225</p>
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
IMPACT:

We are committed to providing a wide range of sporting activities for our children to enjoy. We have been delighted with the response to the clubs on offer for our children this academic year. All staff members encourage children to keep fit and to enjoy sport. Children have shared their successes out of school showing a wide variety of medals and certificates. A Year 5 pupil inspired children telling us about her visit to Reykjavik in Iceland to compete in the Inclusive Skating Competition where she achieved a GOLD medal! This is an international, invitational event. She is an athlete for Inspire Peterborough, a charity which promotes inclusive/disability sports.

These will include multiskills, cross country running, bench ball and dance.</p> <p>The school is fully committed to the varied programme on offer through the Boston Sports' Partnership. The school will attend events in Sportshall Athletics, Netball, Football, Cross Country, Kwik Cricket, Capture the Castle and Change4Life. The programme offers opportunities for children of all abilities to represent their school.</p>	<p>£1800</p>

Children throughout the school have thoroughly enjoyed competing against other classes in a variety of sporting competitions. They all showed great sportsmanship and competitiveness. We have represented the school in a wide variety of sporting competitions this year. Pupils from Years 3 and 4 came 1st and Years 5 and 6 qualified for the finals in the Sports Hall Athletics competition; Dance Club won the Boston and District Dance Festival with an amazing dance routine and the netball team came 1st and competed in the School Games' competition.
